A local museum is looking for volunteers, and Idaho National Laboratory employees are pitching in. A Team INL employee volunteer project is recruiting people to help monitor precious items in the Museum of Idaho's next exhibit. "Titanic: The Artifact Exhibition" opens March 5.

The stuff of pond scum could one day fuel your car. That is the business model behind a collaboration INL sealed last week with OriginOil. INL researchers will help the company figure out how to scale up its process for making biofuels from algae. Algae could have advantages over other biofuel crops because it takes less time and energy to grow.

INL recently co-wrote a report with the Electric Power Research Institute, or EPRI. The report, titled "A Strategy for Nuclear Energy Research and Development," outlines six goals for expanding the safe and economical use of nuclear energy across the U.S.
